Quality Assurance - St. Michael's CE School Safeguarding Statement

At St. Michael's we take notice of and adhere to all the national and local policies and guidance in regard to Safeguarding Children and Young People.

The Governors and staff of St. Michael's CE School fully recognise their statutory responsibilities and duties placed upon them to have arrangements in place to safeguard and promote the welfare of all pupils at the school. We recognise that **all** staff, including volunteers, have a full and active part to play in protecting pupils from harm. We believe that our school should provide a safe, caring, positive, and stimulating environment in which pupils can learn and which promotes the social, physical and emotional wellbeing of each individual pupil.

*This also extends to our commitment to the **Project Tearose** which the school has agreed to sign up to the project as a further channel of communication to safeguard the pupils within our care.*

The Project Tearose

St. Michael's CE School has signed up to Project Tearose which is an information sharing agreement between the Metropolitan Police and Wandsworth Borough Schools. The information points below give an overview of the purpose of Project Tearose.

- If police have responded to a domestic incident and there are children in the family, the officers working on Project Tearose will disclose this incident to the Headteacher of St. Michael's CE School or the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) by 9am the following morning (Monday to Friday).
- The information is shared securely with either the Headteacher or the Designated Safeguarding Leads, and is treated as sensitive and confidential.
- The information is shared in order to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the child and that a network of support can be established as necessary. This will also ensure that St. Michael's CE School is part of the triangulated network available to support the family and child (ren).
