END OF YEAR REPORT 2019-2020



- For the whole of the 2019-20 school year there were **182 behaviour incidents** recorded on CPOMS, our online behaviour monitoring system. The chart below shows the number and types of incidents recorded.

Analysis

- The year-on-year comparison shows a positive improvement in behaviour at St. Michael's. There were 49 fewer behaviour incidents in the 2019-20 school year compared to the year before. This is a **reduction of 21%**. However, this is partly the result of fewer incidents taking place since 20 March, when not all pupils were in school full-time because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Nevertheless, even before lockdown there were signs of behaviour improvement, underpinned by better and more consistent behaviour management strategies used by teachers (one of our whole school priorities for 2019-20).
- There are some noteworthy changes in the types of incidents recorded during the 2019-20 school year. There were no recorded cyberbullying incidents (compared to 2 in 2018-19), no recorded cases of racism (2 in 2018-19) and only one case of physical bullying (compared to 13 in 2018-19). Incidents of non-compliance have also dropped - from 31 in 2018-19 to 24 in 2019-20.
- For some types of behaviours, the records show a slight increase in the number of incidents recorded. For example, cases of fighting have increased (from 11 in 2018-19 to 16 in 2019-20) and there were 5 cases of aggression towards staff (compared to 2 cases in 2018-19). Overall, the number of verbal/aggressive incidents is showing a downward trend, from 48 incidents in 2018-19 to 39 incidents in 2019-20.
- There were no exclusions during the school year. This compares to a local exclusion average for primary schools in Wandsworth of 0.93% and a national figure of 1.4%.
