Analysis	<p>Everybody knows what to do if a child raises a concern and asks to keep it a secret.</p> <p>89% of staff know what to do if a cleaner is in school without ID.</p> <p>72% of staff know what to do about a child playing games with an age limit beyond their years.</p> <p>94% Know what a SLAP is</p> <p>98% of staff would act appropriately when they see bruising on a child.</p> <p>87% of staff would alert the DSL if talking about guns, violence and inappropriate behaviour within families.</p> <p>89% know are aware of FGM and would alert the DSL about long holidays in associated countries.</p> <p>All staff know what to do if someone is taking photos of children in the playground from outside the school.</p> <p>68% of staff would act appropriately if a colleague was posting pictures of children on social media.</p> <p>94% of staff would know what action to take if a parent took photos on a school trip.</p>
Action	<p>Main concerns are in reference to social media and e-safety.</p> <p>These will be included in staff meetings as part of our reminders and processes clarified.</p> <p>Talk to staff regarding cleaner ID to make sure everyone knows the process.</p> <p>Remind staff of their responsibility regarding safeguarding.</p> <p>Clarification on the term 'SLAP' to staff for those that were not sure.</p> <p>Reminders for recording process and a 'gentle' approach.</p> <p>Clarification that all safeguarding concerns go through the DSL – PREVENT and FGM.</p> <p>Reminders about photographs/use of social media.</p>
Impact	<p>SLT will investigate online learning in relation to safeguarding to utilise time whilst the country is in lock down.</p> <p>All staff will receive additional safeguarding training in relation of use of social media and e-safety.</p> <p>On return to school all areas of the survey will be discussed and clarified so all are aware of the processes.</p>
